

The Melbourne Visitor Shuttle is a **free** bus service, stopping at key tourist attractions and destinations in and around the city.

Onboard you can view the city in comfort while listening to an informative commentary about the city's attractions. You can hop on and off at any of the 13 stops.

The shuttle runs daily, every 30 minutes from 9.30am to 4.30pm, excluding Christmas Day. The full journey takes approximately 90 minutes.

The first service departs from stop one at 9.30am, with the last service departing from stop one at 3.45pm. All services complete the full journey and terminate at stop one, including the last service of the day.

Please note, the shuttle is a popular service and passengers may experience overcrowding during busy periods.

City Circle Tram

The free City Circle Tram is a convenient way to see the sights of central Melbourne while experiencing a ride on one of the city's iconic, historical trams.

The service operates from 10am to 6pm Sunday to Wednesday and 10am to 9pm Thursday to Saturday, excluding Good Friday and Christmas Day.



Arts Centre Melbourne, with its iconic spire, has a number of gallery and performance spaces including the Performing Arts Museum which tells the story of circus, dance, music, opera, and theatre in Australia. The NGV International houses Victoria's impressive international collection and nearby is the Australian Centre for Contemporary Art (ACCA) and the Malthouse Theatre. The city's newest arts venue the Melbourne Recital Centre is home to the Melbourne Theatre Company and the Dame Elizabeth Murdoch Recital Hall.

Stop 2 Federation Square

Home of the **Melbourne Visitor Centre**, your one-stop-shop for tourist information and booking services, Federation Square is a vibrant precinct conveniently positioned in the centre of Melbourne. Federation Square brings together a creative mix of attractions, including the **Ian Potter Centre: NGV Australia**, **ACMI – Australian Centre for the Moving Image**. Federation Square also boasts a range of restaurants, cafes, bars, open public spaces which host up to 2,000 events annually. Free guided walking tours are available from Monday to Saturday at 11am (one hour duration).

You'll also find Melbourne's contemporary riverside park **Birrarung Marr**, and **ArtPlay** with its fantastic kids' playground.

Melbourne is a passionate sporting city, home to a fantastic array of local, national and international events. Hop off here to visit or take a tour of the Melbourne Cricket Ground (MCG) and the National Sports Museum. The Rod Laver Arena, Melbourne Park, Olympic Park, Hisense Arena and AAMI Park are popular venues for a wide range of sport and entertainment activities.

From this stop it is only a short walk to the historic **Fitzroy Gardens** with its many charms, including **Cooks' Cottage**, **the Fairy Tree**, **model Tudor Village**, **Conservatory** and more.

Stop 4 Chinatown Precinct

Melbourne has long been the theatrical heart of Australia and many of the theatres in this area are known for their stunning architecture including **Her Majesty's**, **Princess** and **Comedy Theatres**. Don't miss **Chinatown** on Little Bourke Street – a slice of Asia in the heart of the city with a smorgasboard of Asian cuisines and arcades selling everything from Chinoiserie to funghi. You can learn about the history and customs of Chinese Australians at the **Chinese Museum**.

Here you can view the exciting displays and exhibitions of **Melbourne Museum** and its **IMAX Theatre**, the World Heritage listed **Royal Exhibition Building** and **Carlton Gardens**. Carlton Gardens is the home of the 1891 Curator's Lodge and three important fountains: the Hochgurtel Fountain, the French Fountain, and the Westgarth Fountain. It is only a short walk to the **Old Melbourne Gaol**.

Stop 6 Lygon Street Precinct

Lygon Street in Carlton is the historic heartland of Melbourne's Italian community. Italian restaurants spill on to the footpaths, with pasta to savour and cake to devour. This area is renowned for its links to Melbourne's experimental and fringe theatre scene with **La Mama** and the **Carlton Courthouse** theatres.

Stop 7 University of Melbourne

The **University of Melbourne**, displaying varied eclectic architectural styles, houses its own museums, galleries and special collections. It is also home to both the **Ian Potter Museum of Art** and the **Grainger Museum**.
